When I joined BAMTA in 1972 (yep, before some of you were even born!), the first major job I volunteered for was co-chair of the yearly BAMTA recital. We (BAMTA) didn't yet have our own piano so the recital was held at the Unitarian Church, and so many members asked to present students that we actually had to turn students away in order to let every studio that requested, be represented. Wanting to try something a little out-of-the ordinary, my co-chair and I decided to have Eloise Ristad (yes, the A Soprano on Her Head Eloise Ristad who was just beginning to find her voice in the then new world of improvisation/performance anxiety/learning styles, etc.) "warm up" the performers and the audience with one of her group improvisations before the playing began. Eloise spent about 10 minutes, as I recall, leading us in clapping, tapping all over each others' bodies (well, almost), and spitting out all sorts of unusual rhythms in unusual ways with our mouths. The room of 75-or-so people absolutely rocked with rhythm! And it was so much fun! Or at least I thought so. However, at the next BAMTA meeting, there was a small group of "mature" teachers who spent the first half (or so it seemed to me) of the meeting describing their reactions to the "mess" we'd created by allowing such inappropriate behavior into their "serious" world of piano recitals. And they didn't just talk about it at that meeting. Comments about our "mess" were made at every meeting for months, to the extent that I ALMOST QUIT BAMTA!

While I think they went a little overboard (OK, a *lot* overboard), I now know what it's like to be one of those "mature" teachers whose world is sometimes changing too fast. And with only a third of my life remaining (!), I find myself less and less willing to spend time doing things I dislike. One of those "things" is sitting at a computer.
