PIANOS ALIVE CONCERT

You are invited to the Sixth Annual Pianos Alive concert, January 29, 2016. The concert will be at First Presbyterian Church, 1820 15thStreet, Boulder, at 7:00 p.m. Of the twelve pianists who will share the five grand pianos on stage, five are affiliated with BAMTA and Federated: Mitzi Babb, Susan Rudosky, Pat Holmberg, Laura Smith, and Richard Capp. The program includes Bizet's lively Bohemian Dance, the beautiful Nocturne from Borodin's 2nd String Quartet, Beethoven's Fifth Symphony (first movement) arranged for five pianos by Pat Holmberg (retired BAMTA member and founding President, 1962), Jesu Joy of Man's Desiring, the lyrical Waltz from Tschaikovsky's Serenade for Strings, a selection of Brahm's Waltz's, and more.
