Our MPF Repertoire presentation May 19th is a "not to be missed experience" because you can hear all the music played with all 4 hands, rather than playing through it with just two hands in your own studio. Additionally, when you come in person you can record the pieces so your students can hear what the repertoire sounds like with 4 hands when you introduce it to them.

BAMTA introduces the music in May because most teachers start their students on MPF music in June. This gives students great music to work on, inspiring them to practice all summer long. Members of the MPF Steering Committee and BAMTA Board members will be available to answer questions about the festival at the meeting. We hope you will join us!
