SPRING—take repeat

SANTA CLAUS IS COMING TO TOWN — Please add a spoken "Ho, ho, ho" at the end, beats 2&3 (cha-cha-cha but with ho, ho, ho)

GROUP A3

CARILLON—Add a rit. in m. 6 (before the "broadly" tempo)

- notice that there was a typo on the first repertoire sheet the tempos are for the EIGHTH note beat.
- if the secondo is having difficulties with the LH reaches at m. 19, 20 etc., they can adapt by leaving out the notes that start on counts 3 and 4.
- m.19: Primo play mp

BIRTHDAY BOUQUET— Ask Karen Ziegler for a copy of the piece. After auditions, the students who are playing in the concert will get an "official" copy with the permission letter, and at that time, all other copies must be destroyed as they will not be legal.

- SWING Theme, Var. 3 and Var. 4
- Use pedal for the Theme.
- NO pedal in Var.1 or Var. 2.
- Primo can leave out the C in the LH for the first full measure of Var. 2.
- Var. 3, pedal ONLY the last chord. ADD a tremolo in both primo and second, holding only for the 2 beats indicated.

BEETHOVEN SONATA IN D ---

<u>Prefered edition is Alfred, ed. Kowalchyk and Lancaster.</u> The dynamics are more accurate, and it is easier to read.

No pedal

<u>Tempo:</u> dhn=72 (the first typed repertoire list had a typo, this is the correct tempo) <u>Dynamics</u>: in addition to the dynamics printed in the score, do the following: end phrases (usually 4 measures) with a decrescendo; e.g., mm. 6-7, 11-12, etc. Crescendo as notes (usually 8ths) ascend, and decrescendo as notes descend; e.g. secondo, mm. 8-9, both parts mm. 54-56.

If you are using the 44 Original Duets edition, change the accent from beat three to beat one in mm. 30-32 and mm. 127-129.
