BAMTA Meeting on October 20, 2023

Presentation by the CU Boulder Collegiate Chapter of MTNA on the topic of "Transitioning into Collegiate Music Studies"

How can private music teachers best equip their students to excel in collegiate music programs? Knowing that many young musicians encounter challenges as they adjust to the rigors of college, the CU Boulder Collegiate Chapter of MTNA asked students to reflect on their transition into collegiate music studies. Using findings from their 2022 research, the chapter will present insights from a broad group of music majors that will help inform private instructors as they prepare students for higher education. The presentation will include concrete takeaways for teachers and resources for students considering music school.

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Multiple Piano Festival 2023

Hello BAMTA members,

The registration deadline for MPF is this Saturday, October 14, 2023.

- 1) Sign yourself up as a participating teacher using this link. <u>https://forms.gle/5uVpH59Doqvon1c47</u>. Jill Ice will then share with you the Google documents to sign up your students.
- 2) Sign up your students on the **Master List** for the group they are playing with (A1, A2, A3, B1, B2 or C). If at all possible, we appreciate if you sign up this week. Getting it

done this week will help teachers find possible partners for students from other studios and help the steering committee prepare for the concert.

Within the Google docs folder with the Master List, you also need to **sign your students up for all the individual pieces** they are working on. Remember they can only play pieces within one level. If they don't master a piece that you signed them up for in time for the audition, you can take their names off of the list before the October 14 registration deadline.

- 3) Email the MPF information letter, attached below, to parents and students that are participating in your studio. Be sure to go over the important details of the letter in your lessons verbally and answer any questions parents may have.
- 4) Read the MPF letter for teachers, attached below, carefully and contact Shari Griswold at <u>shmstudio1@gmail.com</u> or 720-280-5871, if you have any questions.
- 5) Attend the Friday, October 20 BAMTA meeting to get the latest information, to help with planning the event, and to get to know the teachers you will be working with closely at the auditions, rehearsals and performance.
- 6) Conductor notes: There are important updates in the conductor notes for all levels. *Teachers with students in A3 and B2* want to check the notes ASAP due to significant and important changes.

7) For those of you preparing students for Level C, the format is changing this year for how auditions will be handled. Details below.

Prepare students to play the entire piece with the indicated metronome tempo Students will be randomly spot checked with the metronome (at reasonable starting points)

Subsequently, students will play the entire piece with the conductor One piano at a time

Marvin Blickenstaff joined The New School in 1999, and serves as co-director of the PEPS Program. Mr. Blickenstaff holds degrees from the Oberlin Conservatory of Music and Indiana University, where he received both academic and performance honors. He is well-known across the country and in Canada for his frequent presentations at state and national conferences. The Marvin Blickenstaff Endowment Fund was established in his honor by the Music Teachers National Association Foundation. In 2007 the online journal Piano Pedagogy Forum published tributes to Mr. Blickenstaff honoring his contribution to piano teaching in America. Also in 2007, he was named Fellow of the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto. He was honored in 2009 with MTNA's highest honor, the MTNA Achievement Award. Mr. Blickenstaff has served as chair of the piano departments at the University of North Carolina/ Chapel Hill and Goshen College (IN) and from 2000-2013 he was President of the Frances Clark Center for Keyboard Pedagogy.
