BAMTA PIANO/RECITAL SPACE AVAILABLE TO RENT

I am currently taking recital rental reservations for the fall semester (September – December). The BAMTA piano (Yamaha grand) is housed at Harvest Church in Gunbarrel - 7493 Old Mill Trail, Boulder, CO 8030 (Corner of 75th and Old Mill Trail). This piano/recital space is available for rent:

- Most Friday evenings
- Saturdays after 1:00
- Most Sundays after 2:00
- Occasionally Monday-Thursday evenings

There is a fellowship hall and kitchen that can be used for receptions if desired, however, this area is not available on Saturdays until 4:30. Receptions may also be held in the hallway outside of the sanctuary. Several long tables are in the hallway that can be used for food and beverage service.

The rental fee is \$65 for a 3-hour block of time. Please consider using this lovely and affordable space for your next recital, as your rental costs go toward the maintenance of the piano and the continuation of the relationship with Harvest Church.
