I am very happy to announce that the Multiple Piano Festival earned us almost \$3,000 and our audience was considerably bigger than last year. Congratulations and thank you for everyone's hard work!

We had 167 participants this year (up 20 from 2023). We sold approximately 464 tickets (up 75 from 2023). Our net profit is \$2,935.72.

I am the coordinator for the BAMTA piano (Yamaha grand) that is housed at Harvest Church in Gunbarrel - 7493 Old Mill Trail, Boulder, CO 8030 (Corner of 75th and Old Mill Trail). This piano/recital space is available for rent:

- Most Friday evenings
- Saturdays after 1:00
- Most Sundays after 2:00
- Occasionally Monday-Thursday evenings

There is a fellowship hall and kitchen that can be used for receptions if desired, however, this area is not available on Saturdays until 4:30. Receptions may also be held in the hallway outside of the sanctuary. Several long tables are in the hallway that can be used for food and beverage service.

The rental fee is \$65 for a 3-hour block of time. Please consider using this lovely and affordable space for your next recital, as your rental costs go toward the maintenance of the piano and the continuation of the relationship with Harvest Church.

If you have never used this recital space before and would like to arrange a 15-20 building tour, let me know and I would be happy to arrange a time that works for both of us.

I will begin taking reservations for the winter/spring semester (January – May) on January 13. Rental directions, fees, etc. are located on the BAMTA website – For Teachers/Student Recitals.
